MATTY DOUGLAS

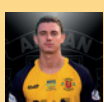

Midfielder Benjamin signs after impressing manager Peter Murphy during pre-season.

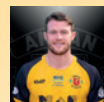

SPFL IN NEW SKY TV DEAL NEGOTIATIONS

In a new approach to the Income Stream Model for Scottish Football the Scottish Premiership clubs have come together to set a plan that would hopefully drive the SPFL's annual distributable income to £50m by 2029.

A Deloitte report was initially commissioned by Dundee, Dundee United, Hearts, Hibs and Aberdeen and this was discussed by the SPFL in December. Following further recommendations by the working group then the involvement of Celtic and Rangers the clubs have managed to gain broad support for the proposal.

Currently the SPFL distributes £28.4m a year to its member clubs through its current distribution model. As we break that figure down in real terms it translates to 0.2% being distributed to clubs in League 2.

As well as the SKY deal the BBC currently has a deal for radio commentary, Premiership TV highlights and live Championship TV games, while Premier Sports screen live Scottish League Cup matches.



So What Do They Hope To Achieve?

The clubs proposal would aim to move the SPFL to a more robust dynamic commercial structure. The belief is that the SPFL is largely an administrative function and this change would give more focus to the commercial needs of the brand.

Talks are looking to extend the current Sky Broadcasting contract to 2029, currently this deal runs out in 2025 and any extension would provide further security to the SPFL member clubs.

The introduction of PPV is also on the table as clubs in the lower leagues look to build on the audiences built during the Covid pandemic. Currently clubs like Annan are unable to broadcast on a Saturday at 3PM due to the terms currently included in the current SKY deal. The deal is very prohibitive to the lower league clubs in relation to these revenue streams and this has been recognised during the talks.

Talking about the deal Hibs chairman Ron Gordon has been speaking about this and he said: "The Deloitte report said Scottish football was marginally undervalued. We are in conversations with Sky on the resetting of our deal, a much more comprehensive relationship that involves the women's game,

more games, carving out some pay-per-view, and a secondary package.

"What's on the table right now has got promotional and commercial partnerships we sell together, promotional elements for Sky and for the league, an investment in more and better content.

"On a per-game basis, we are very well compensated right now. But we have very few games. We have 48 games and they don't even take all 48. Out of 218 games, that leaves a lot of games which are not out there. "In this conversation with Sky, we've tried to have more games but protect the gate – we want our stadiums to be full."

Gordon also discussed the need to improve the brand image and attractiveness of the league to potential investors.

"We're looking to create product that has more to offer a commercial partner," he added. "Many brands in the UK that are in football are not in Scottish football.

"We want to double our commercial revenue from £4m to almost £8m. The women's game really gives us an opportunity to grow brand new revenues because nothing has existed. What we're looking at with broadcasting alone – that we're in discussions on right now – could be £2.5m or more over the next five-seven years.

"The other key elements are strengthening the brand of the league. There's been a lot of bad blood, people have been cynical about the league, but Scottish football does a lot more good than bad. Every club is a difference-maker in its community and it's a passion point in Scotland. It's very, very real.

"We should harness all the good football does and create a brand that is very positive. Good brands want to associate with good brands. The branding of the league is an important thing we all need to get behind."

SPFL chief executive Neil Doncaster thanked Aberdeen, the Old Firm and the Dundee and Edinburgh clubs for "their valuable work" and added: "It is an exciting time for the game."



SWPL Comes Under The SPFL

In an effort to drive further improvements in the Womens game the SWPL1 and 2 divisions will compete under the SPFL, bringing all football under the one organisation.

In an effort to showcase and promote the game further BBC Alba will increase the number of live games it broadcasts from six to 26, while BBC Scotland will show an extended 45 minute highlights programme each week. It will also have the option to stream one live game each weekend.

"The ongoing partnership with both BBC ALBA and BBC Scotland will be vital in growing the game in this country in the coming years, and their long-term support of the women's game is truly appreciated," said Fiona McIntyre, SWPL managing director.

"This significant new agreement represents the growth and ambition we have for the League. It was a really exciting opening weekend of the SWPL season, and we know that viewers will be in for a treat for the rest of the season."

"We're delighted that we're increasing coverage of Scottish women's football over the next three years," added Louise Thornton, senior head of multi-platform commissioning at BBC Scotland. "Adding more highlights and live streams will significantly enhance our offering to audiences on an exciting time for the game in Scotland. We're looking forward to working in partnership with BBC ALBA to deliver more free-to-air coverage of the SWPL."

UNACCEPTABLE CONDUCT POLICY

This statement is designed to provide clear information to all officials, employees, shareholders, home and visiting supporters and indeed anyone who exercises a function for or who has a connection with Annandale Athletic Community Football Club Limited ("the Club") as to the Club's attitude and approach to the question of unacceptable conduct.

The Club fully accepts that football is a game of passion. It readily encourages supporters to express their support and add to the enjoyment of the game. The Club will not however tolerate and indeed condemns any form of unacceptable conduct at its Home Ground or at Away Grounds by its supporters. Such unacceptable conduct includes the following:-

- Any violent or disorderly conduct, including any actual, attempted or threatened physical violence against a person or persons;
- Any intentional damage to property;
- Any racist, sectarian or defamatory abuse;
- Any abuse relating to sexual orientation, transgender identity, physical or mental disability;
- Any anti-social behaviour;
- Any throwing of articles in the ground or its surroundings;

The Club reserves the right to take appropriate action if it is suspected that a person seeking entry to the ground is in possession of any article, e.g., flags, banners, and the like which may contain offensive or unacceptable material, flares, fireworks and devices capable of emitting smoke or the like which may cause or be part of an incident of unacceptable conduct.

The Club reserves the right to have such a person searched - those entering the Home Ground are deemed as per the Club's Ground Entry Conditions to have agreed to be subject to such search procedures, and any such articles found during such a search will be removed and delivered to the Match Commander or Safety Officer.

Any such person refusing to be searched will be denied access to the ground and any season ticket or ticket shall be liable to confiscation without compensation and further proportionate action as determined by the Club may follow.

The Club will ensure, as far as is reasonably practicable, the good order, security and safety of all whether players, supporters, officials, who attend the Home Games.

It will further ensure, as far as is reasonably practicable, that its players, officials, supporters and anyone exercising any function relating to the Club do not engage in any Unacceptable Conduct.

The Club will ensure the safe passage of those who require access to the tunnel area and hereby state that it will be the decision of the Safety Officer as to who is allowed in that area. Dissension from a decision of the Safety Officer may be deemed as unacceptable conduct.

The Club will co-operate with Match Officials, match stewards and Police Scotland in relation to any alleged incident of unacceptable behaviour.

Any individual convicted of a football related offence or, who is found by the Board of the Club to have committed a serious breach of this policy, will be subject to appropriate action by the Club which may include a ban from the ground and/or confiscation, without compensation, of any Season Ticket held by that individual.

The Club expects that its fans will fully support this policy and assist the club in tackling any Unacceptable Conduct issues in a proactive manner

During the current pandemic, the Club requires all players, Directors and the management team as well as Supporters and any clubs visiting Galabank to comply with the Club's protocols to combat the threat of the Coronavirus. This would also be the case if there were ever protocols introduced to deal with another pandemic.

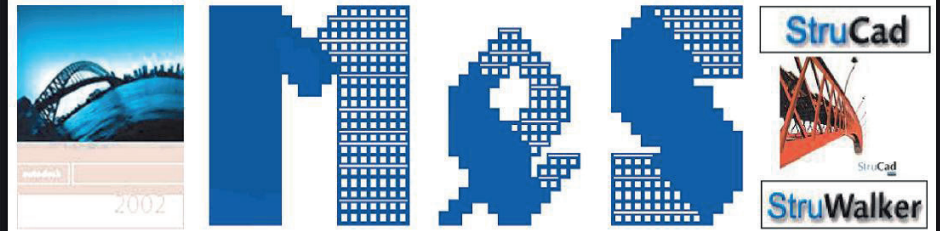
